### **School Daze**

Well, it's back to school, again! I'm retired from teaching, and I do miss it. I especially liked many of the returning days, such as when Carlos got new glasses and told me, "Mrs. Buckham, you looks good with my glasses on, but you looks better with um off." Yes, I miss it!

Anyway, years ago, and I do mean years ago, I became certified to teach Pre-K through 12<sup>th</sup> grade. Then, after years of teaching Elementary Special Education students, I wanted to teach high school students. I was supposed to teach English and Reading, which thrilled me. However, on the opening day of school, I was told that another teacher wanted to teach those subjects, and as the new teacher, I would be teaching Social Studies instead. I was no longer enthused.

I actually always hated Social Studies, because of all of the dates I was supposed to remember. Now, I could remember how to spell CAT, but I just could not remember any dates, other than 1492, and that was merely due to the Columbus poem. So, I really never saw any reason for my trying to remember various dates, but I do now. Yes, I really do now, and fortunately I can also check out dates on a cell phone, rather than my having to lug out the encyclopedia. That is what I used to have to do to find out dates. Dates, which I now have to know during my numerous conversations about historical events. Of course, I could make it easier on myself, and stick to hysterical events, which need no dates, or I could just make up some!!

So, I realized that Social Studies is important, and that this subject can be taught in many thrilling ways. Making up catchy tunes, such as the Columbus one, became one thing we always did, and this type of activity can make returning to school exciting for all each year.

I also found that role-playing lessons could be done often, such as when I taught one particular chapter in the textbook. It stated that the ships, which carried the slaves, had those people layered like sardines. For this, I had my one girl student be in charge of the others, as the boys laid on the floor in a line. We only role-played this for a few minutes, because they thought this was a cruel, evil way to treat people. Lesson accomplished. I remember this lesson, as well as many others, and I feel my students do too.

Teaching Social Studies became extremely interesting, and later when I taught Elementary Students again, I super-charged those lessons. You should have seen us on the playground fighting the Civil War during Grandparents Day!

Again, I learned that God does work in strange ways. I feel it certainly had to be His plan to have me teach Social Studies, so that I could learn that it encompasses so much more than dates. However, there is one year I can always remember. That is the year in which I was born, though I have changed it twice, and because of this I may soon be the youngest of three children rather than the oldest!
