

I especially appreciate the stories about Elias's rich history and the days when the pews were so full that folding chairs had to be placed in the aisles to accommodate worshipers.





Unfortunately, the world has changed and it seems that gathering for church services is no longer a priority for many families. So, where does that leave us? It's no secret that our attendance is not what it used to be. And, in all honesty, our attendance is not what it should be. I'm not pointing fingers. I'm just stating the obvious. And I can promise you that even though our numbers on Sunday mornings are not what I would like to see, I'm as enthusiastic as I was the very first Sunday morning I walked into Elias as your pastor.

My enthusiasm comes from God's word – specifically from the Book of Zechariah. This verse discourages despising small beginnings and anticipates the joy of the completed task of building the Temple.

However, be encouraged that God has called us for such a time as this to stay true to the mission of this church: "Called by Christ, we live our faith in Word and Deed." Doctors! Doctors! I drink lots of water, and I eat lots of fiber, fruits, cheese, etc., but my doctor always finds something wrong with me!!! This time I have carpal tunnel in both hands, of course.

My very good friend, Connie Fisher, said that she would be happy to take me for my surgery. Perhaps it was I who added the word happy. Anyway, Connie took me, and my left hand was "fixed." I could still remember what all I went through to have this local surgery done without anesthesia, so when my right hand was ready a month later, I was *not* ready. However, my appointment had been set up, so I merely had to find out if Connie would be happy to take me again. She wasn't!! Connie had to take her husband, Dick, to the doctor's for Cataract Surgery. My problems began and began and began.

Firstly, the driver that Connie found to replace her could not go at the last minute, because her son had to be hospitalized. Luckily, Pastor Joe volunteered to drive me, but he lived an hour away from me. This would be a two-hour trip for him, so it was really, really nice of him to volunteer.

Then I watched the Weather Channel. I always do that whenever I must leave home, and what to my shining eyes should appear, but a gigantic storm was coming. It was to hit us on my surgery day! Flooding was possible in the area we were going to. I immediately thought, "Is God warning me not to go?" It certainly seemed that way, and besides, my right hand did not ever hurt.

Finally, when the nursing staff called me the night before the surgery to give me my really, really early arrival time, rather than the 9:15 a.m. time I was expecting, I knew that God was most definitely telling me not to go. Besides the fact that Pastor Joe would have to eat his Pop Tarts in the dark, I would have to feed the deer, squirrels, birds, chipmunks, groundhogs, etc., in the dark, too, and I would not be able to see if The Three Bears had come out of the woods. (Actually, if I were a blonde, I might feel like Goldilocks.) The bears would also be coming out to eat - - - maybe me (Mary-Elizabeth)!

Difficulties kept coming and coming, and I just knew that God was desperately trying to tell me not to go. I canceled my appointment!! Later, when my left hand continued to hurt, I realized that I would have had an extremely difficult time doing any kind of jobs, if I would have had my right hand "fixed" too. I need to do things such as pulling weeds from the flower beds, especially since June is busing out all over! Thank you, God, for having me wait for my second surgery, and I think that You do not like to have weeds growing among the flowers either. I am sorry, God that you had such a difficult time with me. Sometimes, God. I just do not heed Your warnings, but I will try to do much better. I feel we all will!


